

TRACK TIMES: Track times are a time where the kids get to do something that interests them! These options range from baseball, volleyball, Build-It, No boys allowed, wet and wild, and lots more! Please see the track time description sheet for more information on each specific track. Each kid will complete a track time card and pick their top 6 tracks ranging in order from 1-6 (1 being the one they want the most). From these selections we will turn in to CentriKid staff and they will use a computer program and it will give each kid 2 of those 6 tracks that they will participate in during the week. This track time card is due by June 1st!



OMC – ORGANIZED MASS CHAOS

OMC is our favorite game at CentriKid Camps! OMC stands for Organized Mass Chaos. It happens in the afternoon after the second session of Bible study on Day 4. Every camper will compete for their color team by completing task cards. Every player is trying to complete a different task, but the biggest rule of the game is that you can't say "no." So every time a camper asks another for help, they must stop their task and help. After a camper completes the task, they drop it into their team's colored bucket and get another task card from the numbered flag indicated on their completed card. The team with the most task cards in their bucket wins! While adults don't complete cards, they still help kids with tasks, take pictures, help in the No Fly Zone, and get very messy.

Every summer at CentriKid Camps, we collect a missions offering. We suggest that you decide on an amount to give and set this amount aside in an envelope before you come and be prepared to give when offering is collected during church group time.

PARENT INFO

- Pray with your child before they leave for camp. Pray for your child and their leaders during the week.
- Review the ARBC Group Activity Guidelines with your child.
- Discuss: 1-Eating all meals; 2-Going to bed on time; 3-Getting up without giving others a hard time! (*Thank you!*)
- Remind children they are responsible for any damages to camp property.
- Adult Chaperones have all had Criminal Background checks and have experience with children.
- We maintain an adult to camper ratio of 1:5. Parents, remind children that Chaperones have given a week of their vacation so that students could have this opportunity! Remind children that they are expected to respect and cooperate with adults at all times! ☐

CentriKid Camp is a summer experience for kids **Grades 3-5**. CentriKid combines creative activities, fellowships, and spiritual growth, challenging kids to a new and deeper relationship with Christ. Bible studies are built around games and activities to help kids discover spiritual truths from the Bible. At CentriKid Camp students are divided into groups for recreation and Bible study based on age ranges by grade completed. Recreation is facilitated within age groups by a member of the CentriKid camp staff. Bible Study is facilitated within age groups by a member of the CentriKid staff as well! Each activity serves a specific purpose and is debriefed so campers can make application in their lives. Kids also participate in Track Times. Track Times are created to give kids the opportunity to participate in something with which they are familiar, or try something new! Kids are divided into "tracks" based on a list of activities they indicate during the registration process. Tracks provide opportunities for such things as missions, outdoor games, sports, water games, Sign Language, drama, for girls only, and many others! CentriKid also offers creative multi-sensory worship experiences designed specifically for kids!

At CentriKid 2019, our theme is "All Access." This summer we will be learning how God wants Himself to be known. He has given you an "all access pass" by revealing His name, the way to Him through Jesus, and His power as an expression of His love for you. God has revealed that He is the only true God, He's not hidden, and He wants a relationship with you!

HOUSING: Cabin style Bunk Bed Rooms (2-4 per room) You will need to bring your own pillow and bedding for a twin bunk bed or a sleeping bag. Most all rooms do have air-conditioning! Be in your room by 10:00pm!

FREE TIME ACTIVITIES: At CentriKid, almost every moment is scheduled. Campers have a few extra minutes around meals and about an hour at the end of the night. Also, in the afternoon from 4:30 pm to dinner we have "Hang Time," which is time for leaders and the staff to hang out with your kids. There will be lots of Hang Time options that campers can choose to take part in. Coffee Shop, Gift Shop, Ice Cream Parlor, Indoor Game Room, Swimming Pool, Basketball Courts, Sand Volleyball, Frisbee, Hiking Trails & more options offered by CentriKid staff.

MEALS: Students are expected to eat all meals in the cafeteria. Students who bring their own stuff for breakfast are still expected to meet their group leader in the cafeteria at the appointed time each morning! If there are special needs, food allergies, or other meal concerns, please let Doug/Dana know prior to leaving.

MEDICAL NEEDS: Non-prescription and prescription drugs for the designated students will be dispensed as needed in accordance with the ARBC Medical Release form and policy. Medications should be in original containers and a zip lock bag. Medication will need to be turned in on the morning we depart for camp! Decisions to seek medical care for our group will be made by group leaders and Joe Sinclair. Parents will be notified as appropriate. We carry a basic first aid kit and supplies on all kids trips. **MEDICAL INSURANCE IS REQUIRED.** If you do not have a current medical insurance policy, a temporary policy must be purchased and in place prior to departure! Talk with Joe Sinclair about the options available. There are several web sites where you may purchase temporary medical insurance.

HOW MUCH MONEY SHOULD I CARRY?

Students will need money for the following. Please do not carry a large amount of money with you.

- Meals on the way to camp: Monday Lunch. (please send this with your child.)
- Friday Lunch (\$10 cash for return trip needs to be in an envelope with students name & turned in on Monday!)
- Additional snacks while traveling and at snack shop— Your call
- Optional: Missions offering and items at the Camp store such as t-shirts, bracelets, & lots more.
- Camper Care Packages(\$30) & Group Photos(\$7) are available! See Aversboro CentriKid Camp Order form for details and please turn this in by June 1st! **These must be preordered by June 1st!**

SNACKS/DRINKS: We will provide snacks & drinks for your kids throughout the week that they can eat during afternoon & evening hang time. If you child has specific allergies to food, please let Doug/Dana know so we can make appropriate accommodations.

TRANSPORTATION: Church Mini-Bus & Church Van driven by approved drivers.

CELL PHONES/ELECTRONICS: We understand most parents today are used to having instant communication with their kid by call or text. However, we also know they are a *tremendous distraction* to our kid and other kids at camp. We ask that you do not send any cell phones or electronics with your kid to camp! We want them to get the most out of this experience as possible and these devices distract them.

WHAT TO BRING

- Linens(Twin size bunk bed), towels, pillows, or sleeping bag.
- Water bottle you can refill and carry with you
- Bible, notepad, and pen
- Toiletries such as toothbrush and shampoo
- Sunscreen/ Bug Spray
- A watch

THINGS TO LEAVE AT HOME

- Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, knife, or any kind of weapon
- Electronics, iPods, Cell Phones, or earbuds of any kind.
- Items that may be used for pranks such as water balloons, shaving cream, silly string, etc.

MAKE SURE YOUR STUDENT DOES NOT PACK ANYTHING THAT:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, or drugs. • Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person. • Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations. • Has spaghetti/small straps or open back, except for sleepwear. • Is excessively short or tight fitting.

WHILE AT CAMP, WE ASK THAT STUDENTS:

- Wear sleeved t-shirts (no tank-tops) and **modest shorts** • Closed-toe and closed-heel shoes while at recreation and track times (and during OMC). • Clothes you can get messy in at OMC • Modest, one-piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a dark colored t-shirt, if participating in water activities. • Modest shorts, pants, or jeans for worship. • Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc.) or wear pants or shorts with lettering on the bottom. • Kids are expected to demonstrate respect for others by following the dress code and instructions of all adult leaders if asked to change!

Please limit your child to one suitcase, a pillow, and a book bag. We have limited space on the vans!
